

**COOL FACT:** This is a special place where people come to meet their friends and pray. It was built 125 years ago!






Look at the shapes on this card. **Can you trace your finger along their edges?**




**CIRCLE**

**The Museum at Eldridge Street** is located in the Eldridge Street Synagogue, a National Historic Landmark where immigrants from Russia and Poland gathered to pray and socialize. The magnificent synagogue, built in 1887, is located where Chinatown meets the old Jewish Lower East Side.
